CHILDREN'S CHRISTMAS RECIPE CHRISTMAS SNOWBALLS

Ingredients:

150g bar dark chocolate, broken into chunks

10 fat white marshmallows

white hundreds and thousands

lots of milk, to serve

10 lollipops or cake popsticks, to serve

Method

Bring a pot of water to a simmer over a low heat. Put the chocolate in a heat proof bowl and sit it on top of the pot, making sure that the water doesn't touch the bottom of the bowl, and gently melt the chocolate.

Push a lollipop or cake pop stick into each marshmallow.

Check the chocolate is melted completely by giving it a stir, then scrape it into a smaller bowl. Tip the white sprinkles into another small bowl. Put a wire rack next to the bowl of chocolate and a sheet of baking parchment next to the bowl of sprinkles.

Holding the end of a stick, dip a marshmallow into the chocolate so that it is completely coated. Lift it out, but hold it over the bowl to allow the extra chocolate to drip back in, then put it on the wire rack. Dunk the marshmallows, one by one, then line them up on the wire rack in the order that you dunked them.

Pick up the first marshmallow you dunked and dip into the sprinkles to completely coat. Sit the snowball marshmallow on the baking parchment. Continue to dip and coat the marshmallows, working along the line so that you cover them in sprinkles in the same order that you dunked them in chocolate. When all the marshmallows are covered, leave them on the baking parchment until they are set.

You can now wrap the marshmallows in cellophane and tie with ribbons if you're giving them as a present. Alternatively, if you want to enjoy them right away, warm 1 mug of milk – in a microwave or saucepan – per snowball. Use your snowball as a stirrer in each mug of milk and keep stirring until all the sprinkles, chocolate and most of the marshmallow has melted. Make sure the milk is not too hot. These will keep for about two weeks in a cellophane bag.

Dont forget to check that your parents are aware that you are making these.

New Zealand Dairy Industry Awards – Central Plateau Media Q&A

Entries in the 2016 New Zealand Share Farmer of the Year, New Zealand Dairy Manager of the Year and New Zealand Dairy Trainee of the Year competitions are now being accepted online at this website. All entries close on November 30.

1. What are the NZ Dairy Industry Awards?

The Awards are aimed at showcasing and supporting New Zealand's future dairy leaders. The Awards were created to bring under one umbrella the Federated Farmers Sharemilker of the Year competition, the Fonterra Westpac Dairy Excellence Awards and the Dairy Farmers of New Zealand, Dairy Trainee of the Year.

The competition is designed for farmers to demonstrate their farming expertise and business management skills. The Awards are a great way for farmers to increase their profile and kick start their careers.

2. What does the competition involve?

Contestants are judged on their performance in a number of areas such as financial, pasture, livestock management, business sustainability, communication, employment relations and farm safety. Contestants have a practical on-farm assessment as well as an interview. The regional winners go on to represent Central Plateau at the New Zealand Dairy Industry Awards.

There have been significant changes to the entry criteria in the 2016 awards programme to enable more people to enter the awards and to ensure the competitions are more even. Those considering entering one of the competitions can learn more about the changes and which competition they are eligible to enter on the website.

3. Who can enter?

We are encouraging everyone from farm workers to sharemilkers to enter.

There are three categories that contestants can enter –

Sharemilker/Equity Farmer of the Year, Dairy Manager of the Year and Dairy Trainee of the Year.

- (a) Sharemilker/Equity Farmer of the Year is open to self-employed farmers with responsibility for all aspects of the farming business including herd owning and variable order sharemilkers, contract milkers, equity partners or managers, and lessees.
- (b) The Dairy Manager of the Year and is open to all salaried farm workers with some management responsibilities such as farm managers, assistant farm managers, heard or production managers or second in charge.
- (c) The Dairy Trainee of the Year is open to contestants between 18 and 25 years with less than 3 years' on-farm experience.

4. What are the benefits of entering the Awards?

There will be a huge prize pool of cash and product donated by our sponsors. Last year at the regional Awards dinner we gave away thousands of dollars' worth of prizes to our overall winners and merit award winners. With the overall winners receiving up to \$15,000 in prizes.

We are also giving away prizes simply for entering early. There is a total prize pool of \$8,000 in travel vouchers and \$4,000 with three prize draws. Contestants must enter before 20 November 2015 for a chance to win early bird prizes.

Contestants essentially gain a free business appraisal and by having independent parties go through your business with a fine tooth comb and find out where savings can be made. Previous contestants have said that feedback from the judges is hugely beneficial and can be a game changer for the future direction of their business.

The competition also provides contestants with a unique opportunity to network, make friends and meet other farmers and business contacts. There are plenty of opportunities to network with other entrants, industry professionals, leading farmers and organisers. It is a great way to and increase their farming profile and boost their career.

For many contestants, entering the competition is a huge career boost. The Awards provide farmers with credibility and opens up job opportunities. The regional Awards dinners are also attended by the wider farming community and many farm owners will attend the Awards dinner hoping to find potential employees and business partners.

Took us about 6 hours and 40 beers, but we got it done just as we finished off the last of the burgers.

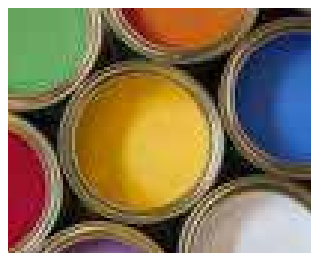

I commend our staff who have taken Jump Jam to these levels over the years, your continued commitment to the children of Ngongotaha School is appreciated.

The annual Ahurei week will be held from Monday 16th November to Friday 20th November, this being the 40th year (previously known as the Rotorua Primary Schools Maori Festival). Our children will perform on Thursday 19th November. Te Kura o Ruamata will be first, with Ngongotaha second followed by Rotorua Primary School. We look forward to an entertaining first half programme. Good luck to all the children who are going on stage and a big thank you to staff who have been tutoring the group in preparation for this. There are many local community members who will remember being on stage and who are now in local competitive groups.

We will be holding our school athletics day on Wednesday 11th

November. This is an annual event and has been held for many years. We have seen a number of excellent athletes at this event and I am sure we will see some more up and coming athletes again this year. The programme for Year 4, 5, 6 and some year 3 children will start at 9.15am on the top field. The remainder of the children will take part in modified athletic activities on the turf and grass area in front of Room 14 and 15. You are more than welcome to come along and support the children on the day, be sure to bring some shade with you if it is a hot sunny day. The children will need to bring a hat, sunblock and drink bottle. A team will be selected, from this event, to represent the school at the Central Athletics on Tuesday 24th November.

Our beautiful cherry trees were again a picture this year. When they pop out in blossom they create a very impressive entrance to the school. They are now in full leaf and are providing much shade and shelter on sunny days. These trees were planted over ten years ago and certainly enhance the environment for the children. We have planted two new trees beside the outdoor stage which have just come out in blossom. These will provide much needed shade to the play area in the junior school beside the turf.

Our property work is still in progress with the last of the hand rails to be installed. The new deck areas, with ramps, have been completed and are making the rooms much more accessible. The new asphalt has been laid which has removed the uneven surface which was a safety issue for children and staff. Once the last of the hand rails are complete we will be looking to the future needs of the school. The Board of Trustees have met to start planning our property developments. If you are in the school regularly and see things we should consider please let us know.

Our garden group is busy with planting and expanding our garden area. We have two worm farms working and if you require worm juice for your garden come in and see us. The children have now set up a number of tyre gardens to complement the boxed gardens that are in full planting now. A number of children work at this during their lunch hours and are learning some valuable life skills.

Thank you to Whaea Shiona and Whaea Lesley who provide the on-going motivation for this area of the school.

All the best for the remainder of November and big congratulations to our All Blacks who recently won the rugby world cup. Great to see these players demonstrate such pride in being a New Zealander.

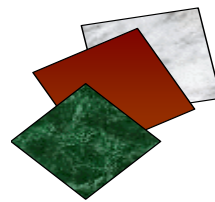

KAHAROA SCHOOL ENROLMENTS

The Board invites applications from parents who wish to enrol their sons and daughters at Kaharoa School for Term 1 2016.

Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available from the school office.

Next year there will be 4 enrolment periods. The first enrolment period runs from 2 February 2016 to 15 April 2016.

The Board has determined places are likely to be available for out of zone students next year in the first enrolment period.

The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone.

For students seeking enrolment within the first enrolment period, the deadline for receipt of applications for out of zone places is 4 December 2015.

Written applications to The Board of Trustees for out of zone places should be made on the schools out of zone enrolment form.

These forms can be obtained from office@kaharoa.school.nz or in the handbook section of our website www.kaharoa.school.nz and returned to the school office

Applications from out of zone students will be processed in the following order of priority:

First priority will be given to students who have been accepted for enrolment in an approved special programme
(This category is not applicable at our school).

Second priority will be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.

Third priority will be given to applicants who are siblings of former students

Fourth priority will be given to applicants who are a child of a former student.

Fifth priority will be given to applicants who are either a child of an employee of the board or a child of a member of the board.

Sixth priority will be given to all other applicants.

If the number of out of zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot. If a ballot is required it will be held on Monday 7 December 2015.

Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three school days of the ballot being held.

If you live in the home zone and have not yet signalled your intention to enrol your child, please contact the school immediately to assist us to plan appropriately

The Mamaku Cemetery - what a great place! Grass, graves, greenery (trees). 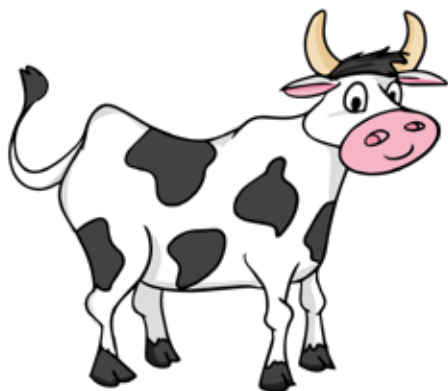

Mr Jim Schuster blessed the garden before an apple tree was planted by the Apperley family and Harakeke from the Renee Orchiston Collection gifted to the school from Scion was planted.

Positive Behaviour for Learning continues to grow from strength to strength with the concepts and reward system now well engrained into the school culture.

Students are given Puawai vouchers for demonstrating any of our four values; Respect - Compassion - Responsibility - Honesty. These are exchanged for colour coded smiley faces which are placed on each students individual Kowhai Blossom on the class tree. When you have 20 Puawai's we send a bronze certificate and letter home to the parent and the students name is put on the wall in the foyer. The same procedure is done at 40 (silver), 60 (gold) and 80 (platinum). When a student has 20 of the same type e.g. honesty they receive a honesty badge.

At present we have 72 students with 20, 14 with 40 and 3 with 60 which shows that our focus on teaching values is working.

Leadership and students voice plays a big part in our school. At present I am interviewing the year 7 students who their teachers have nominated as possible leaders in year 8. We have over 50 nominations which we need to reduce to 10 boys and 10 girls. The 20 lucky ones who will be selected on merit will spend a week long Leadership Camp at the Sir Edmund Hilary Outdoor Pursuits Centre at Tongariro.

Two fun events that we have had recently are our Rugby World Cup and our Super Hero Day. All classes had two teams to support and dressed up in National Costume as well as created flags and bunting for their chosen countries.

Super Hero Day was to raise fund for Wish Upon a Star Foundation and we managed to raise \$600 which will go towards helping one of our students get to Disneyland.

CANDY CANE LOLLIPOPS

12 peppermint candy canes

200g white chocolate, chopped edible sprinkles

You will need

6 ovenproof lolly sticks

cellophane bags and ribbons (if giving as a gift)

Method

Heat oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4 and line 2 baking sheets with baking parchment. Arrange the candy canes in pairs on the trays, to make heart shapes. Put a lollystick between each one, where they meet at the bottom. Put the trays in the oven and cook for 5 mins.

The candy canes should now be soft enough for you to carefully pinch together where they join at the top and the bottom, around the stick. Be careful as the canes will be extremely hot, but work quickly or they will set and you won't be able to pinch them together.

Melt the chocolate in a pan over a bowl of barely simmering water, or in the microwave. Spoon the melted chocolate into the middle of the heart lollies, pushing it out to fill the spaces. Scatter over your choice of sprinkles, then leave to cool completely.

When set, peel off the baking parchment, wrap in cellophane bags and tie with a ribbon to give as a gift.

Remembering Mum's Clothesline

We had a long wooden pole (clothes pole (we called them props) that was used to push the clotheslines up so that longer items (sheets/pants/etc.) didn't brush the ground and get dirty.

THE BASIC RULES FOR CLOTHESLINES:

You had to hang the socks by the toes... NOT the top.

You hung pants by the BOTTOM/cuffs... NOT the waistbands.

You had to WASH the clothesline(s) before hanging any clothes walk the entire length of each line with a damp cloth around the lines.

You had to hang the clothes in a certain order, and always hang "whites" with "whites," and hang them first.

You NEVER hung a shirt by the shoulders - always by the tail! What would the neighbours think?

Wash day on a Monday! NEVER hang clothes on the weekend, or on Sunday, for Heaven's sake!

Hang the sheets and towels on the OUTSIDE lines so you could hide your "unmentionables" in the middle

It didn't matter if it was sub-zero weather.. clothes would "freeze-dry."

ALWAYS gather the clothes pegs when taking down dry clothes! Pegs left on the lines were "tacky"!

If you were efficient, you would line the clothes up so that each item did not need two clothes pegs, but shared one of the clothes pegs with the next washed item.

Clothes off of the line before dinner time, neatly folded in the clothes basket, and ready to be ironed.

IRONED??!! Well, that's a whole OTHER subject!

And now a POEM...

A clothesline was a news forecast,
To neighbors passing by,
There were no secrets you could keep,
When clothes were hung to dry.

It also was a friendly link, For
neighbors always knew
If company had stopped on by, To
spend a night or two.

For then you'd see the "fancy
sheets", And towels upon the line;
You'd see the "company table
cloths", With intricate designs.

The line announced a baby's birth,
From folks who lived inside,
As brand new infant clothes were
hung, So carefully with pride!

Yellow Signs- free Speech

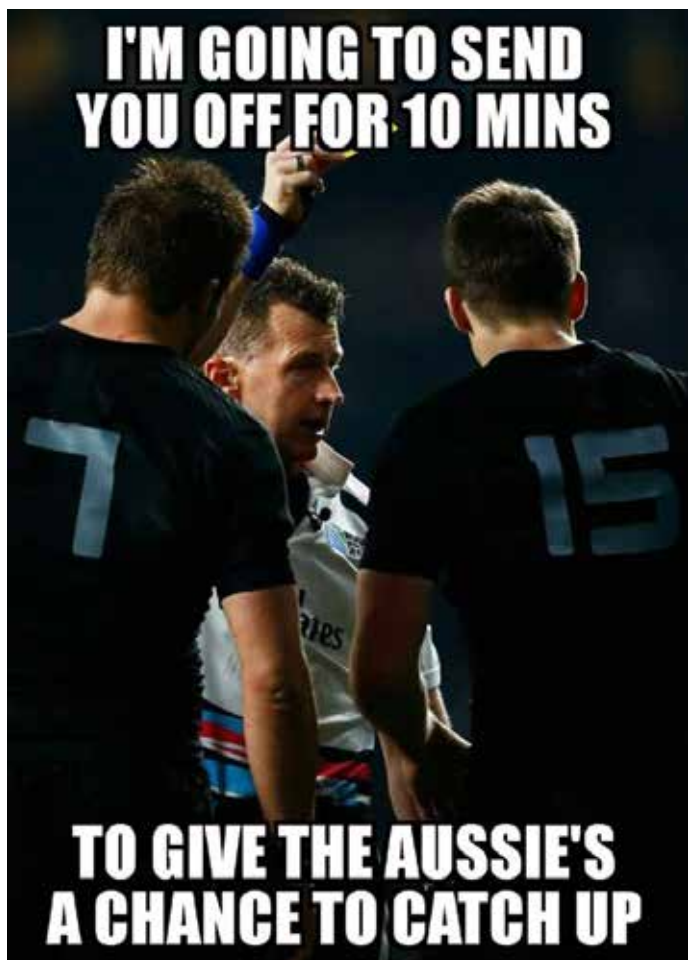
