KAHAROA SCHOOL ENROLMENTS

The Board invites applications from parents who wish to enrol their sons and daughters at Kaharoa School for Term 1 2017.

Enrolment at the school is governed by an enrolment scheme, details of which are available from the school office.

Next year there will be 4 enrolment periods. The first enrolment period runs from 31 January 2017 to 13 April 2017.

The Board has determined places are likely to be available for out of zone students next year in the first enrolment period.

The exact number of places will depend on the number of applications received from students who live within the school's home zone.

For students seeking enrolment within the first enrolment period, the deadline for receipt of applications for out of zone places is 2 December 2016.

Written applications to The Board of Trustees for out of zone places should be made on the schools out of zone enrolment form.

These forms can be obtained from office@kaharoa.school.nz or in the handbook section of our website www.kaharoa.school.nz and returned to the school office

Applications from out of zone students will be processed in the following order of priority:

First priority will be given to students who have been accepted for enrolment in an approved special programme
(This category is not applicable at our school).

Second priority will be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.

Third priority will be given to applicants who are siblings of former students

Fourth priority will be given to applicants who are a child of a former student.

Fifth priority will be given to applicants who are either a child of an employee of the board or a child of a member of the board.

Sixth priority will be given to all other applicants.

If the number of out of zone applications exceeds the number of places available, students will be selected by ballot. If a ballot is required it will be held on Monday 5 December 2016.

Parents will be informed of the outcome of the ballot within three school days of the ballot being held.

If you live in the home zone and have not yet signalled your intention to enrol your child, please contact the school immediately to assist us to plan appropriately

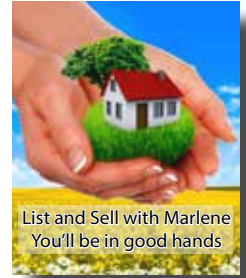

Supporting small businesses to grow

We recently hosted the Minister for Small Business in the electorate to give local business owners a chance to talk directly to the government agencies they deal with day-to-day.

The "Taking Care of Business" event in Rotorua was very popular and allowed business owners to engage with government agencies more effectively and efficiently.

Supporting small and medium-sized businesses is vital because they are the backbone of our communities. 97 per cent of all New Zealand enterprises employ 20 or fewer people and 99 per cent of all businesses in New Zealand have fewer than 50 employees.

In this region it is our hard-working and innovative businesses that drive economic growth and build a more successful economy with more jobs and higher wages for Kiwis.

That's why this government is focused on supporting a competitive and productive economy. It's why we are continuously searching out ways to reduce the financial and time burdens that small businesses face.

We have, for example, cut ACC levies, introduced 90-day trials and a starting-out youth wage, and funded the roll-out of faster broadband. We've set up free online tools and advice from across government to save you time and help make your business a success.

Ngongotaha Community Patrol - Emphasis on Prevention

The month of October has been a significant month for our local Community Patrol and the launch of a national emphasis on prevention and the importance of government agencies working together.

Our Community Patrol AGM saw the current Chairperson (David), Secretary (Jan) and Treasurer (Carol) re-elected unopposed for another year. Unfortunately with the increasing demand on my time working in the area of Health and Safety and the introduction of the new Act, I have had to stand down as Patrol Trainer, which has left a gap to still be filled.

At the AGM our Chairpersons report reminded us that we have had a very successful year, with so very good result focused contacts with our local Police, several wonderful financial gifts, as well as a attendance at a number of BOP Dev/Net Training Days, a National Road Show hosted in Rotorua and our National Training Seminar in Christchurch. He also reminded us that at the BOP AGM held in Kawerau we were presented with an award for the Patrol who achieved the Highest Percentage Increase in Patrolling Hours, in actual fact we were up 126% from the previous year. No mean feat!!

We can directly attribute this to the increase in membership and I hear there are further increases in the wind and the generosity of local businesses and service organisations. All the new patrollers have fitted in well and are now playing an integral part within the patrol and we look forward to further people joining. As our numbers increase we have been able to increase the frequency of our patrols and at the suggestion of our Police Liaison Officer, Sgt. Pauline Jones we have also increased the number of daytime patrols helping to deter day time offending, it also means that we are increasing our profile in the community.

Over the last month you may or may not be aware that our Government have launched two key national crime prevention initiatives to help our Police prevent offending and re-victimisation of some of our community's most vulnerable people.

The first is New Zealand's first Child Sex Offender Register which took effect on the 14th October; it requires those who must be on the register to provide information to allow authorised Police and Corrections staff to monitor and assess any risk they might pose to our community.

Those on the register must notify, in advance, any change of address and whether they are living under the same roof as children. Significant penalties can be imposed on those who fail to report or who provide false information, this includes imprisonment. It's important to note that the register can only be accessed by authorised staff, and is not available to the public.

The second initiative was the announcement of strengthened family violence laws that will provide more robust tools to reduce victimisation and re-victimisation.

Both these initiatives will be underpinned by an emphasis on prevention and the importance of government agencies working together, which includes special taskings given to us by our local Police.

I would like to send a big THANK YOU out to the Rotary Club of Rotorua North for their wonderful financial gift which will go to continuing the work we do in helping to be the Eyes and Ears of our community.

Kiwi Can lessons have been shown to contribute to greater communication skills, social interaction, co-operation and displays of kindness and caring.

When you leave us at the end of your holiday, you will have no hope. You will struggle to forget it.

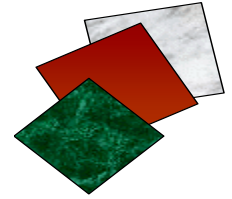

Election.

I have to say a big thank you to all the loyal people of Mamaku, Ngongotaha, Kaharoa and Hamurana for the support I got to be resurrected onto council for my 10th term.

No chairs or portfolios have been allocated yet but I'm sure Mayor Chadwick is observing the attributes and the talent around the table and will use us in a way she sees fit. Great to see unanimous support for the election of Dave Donaldson as Deputy Mayor and Trevor Maxwell as our cultural and international ambassador a role he does so well.

Welcome to new Cr Raj Kumar who has already added colour to our debates and discussions he will be a valuable member of the team. I was delighted that Karen Hunt beat off former councillor Mike McVicker as Karen is one of the hardest working most dedicated members of council. While she has been in a role that hasn't been popular and like me thought about Rotorua's future by having the elected members of Te Arawa at the committee table showed she is a woman of vision. The other great result is that on each of the elected members of the Lakes and Rural Community Boards will join the elected members of Te Arawa around the Council table. This will add the variety of Iwi / Lakeside dwellers and Rural voices to the council table. Pleased that Shirley Trumper and Phil Thomas were elected to chair the Rural and Lakes Boards respectively. Effectively there will be 17 voices at the committee level and of course only elected councillors and the Mayor at full council. Remember matters can be overturned at council if they are not supported by a majority of the 11 at council.

I have to pay tribute to Cr Janet Wepa who lost her seat on council and it seemed inevitable that one or more of the sitting members would loose out, as we cut council down from 13 to 11. Janet who lost her most ardent supporter her husband Matthew earlier in the year was a workaholic at council in the sustainability area and her committee operations and monitoring were responsible for recycling bins as you all should have. I was deputy Chair and I saw first hand how hard Janet worked and as well respected by Staff and most of her colleagues.

Its was not fair that the RDRRs targetted those of us who supported the Te Arawa partnership of European descent, however mark my words that is probably the most important thing I have supported in the years on council. Why, because I was sick of seeing all ratepayers' money from both Maori and Non Maori going down a hole at the Environment Court. Those cases cost the ratepayers, yes you and I \$millions to fight Iwi over the Taniwha Spring water draw off and the tragic Rotoma / Rotoehu sewerage scheme which the Judge of the Environment court lambasting council over its disregard for the environment, lakes, sacred lands and the contempt of not talking to the landowners in the area who were iwi.

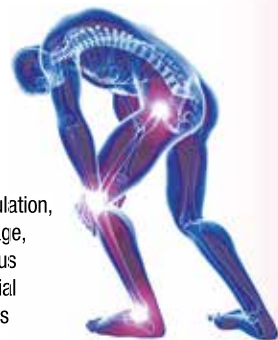

On Friday 28th October I had the privilege of hosting another 'Tabuteau Talks' at Ciccio Italian Café in Arawa Street with special guest NZ First colleague Denis O'Rourke. It was another good turn out to our first morning tea session. There was an overflow of people which the team at Ciccio's quickly accommodated. It was only supposed to go for an hour, but Denis had everyone engaged for a full hour and then everyone stuck around to ask questions on what was important to them for another half hour. Thank you to all the new faces, the brave people who want to know more, but can't be bothered with politics. I think they all agreed, 'Tabuteau Talks' is an open and friendly environment that engages everyone in a way that is a conversation about the issues, not the politics.

Denis was previously a Barrister with 35yrs experience before entering politics and NZ First is very privileged to have Denis as an MP who is thoughtful, enquiring and who also has a heap of portfolio responsibilities, for example; Justice, Attorney General and Courts, Security Issues, Transport, Environment, Housing and the RMA.

Issues such as the Government Security Services, that's the GCSB and SIS operations, where NZ First supported the Review of the whole operations and was then able to make suggestions to the review which seem to have been taken on board. Denis spoke of the Justice and Courts Legislation needing an upgrade and the Courts process needing to be modernised and efficient. At the moment Denis said there is a problem with the Criminal Procedure Act which isn't clear enough to prevent people being given incorrect sentencing and NZ First is supporting a "Criminal Case Review Commission", through the Court of Appeal which will investigate the safety of conclusions. Housing has also been carefully looked at by Denis and NZ First is saying that the current market approach of the Government cannot cope with the demand. Therefore NZ First is proposing setting up a Housing Commission which will look at the availability of sections, rentals, state housing, low cost housing and ensuring quality throughout. The commission will then make recommendations to the Government which will aid long term planning. Denis then spoke with enthusiasm on electrifying the rail system and redeveloping rail. Videos to be produced “by farmers for farmers”

Farmers in the Lake Rotorua catchment will feature in videos providing advice to other farmers about good nutrient management practice. The main objective is to reduce nutrients entering Lake Rotorua although the videos may appeal to a wider audience.


Seven projects have been approved through the Bay of Plenty Regional Council’s Low Nitrogen Land Use Fund (LNLUF) with \$45,000 granted to this particular project. A key focus of this contestable fund is to promote the uptake of proven low nitrogen land uses and practices in the Lake Rotorua catchment.

Fund manager Anna Grayling says the Regional Council is committed to supporting landowners with useful and practical information to reduce nutrient losses.

“We have farmers in the catchment who have already undertaken changes on their farms that demonstrate good practices and a number of them have put their hands up to share their experiences and expertise with their peers.”

Topics covered in the video series will include understanding nitrogen and phosphorous cycles, effluent management, efficient nitrogen fertiliser use, how to integrate good nutrient practices into a farm nutrient plan and more. The project will be co-ordinated by Landconnect Ltd with support from the Lake Rotorua Primary Producers Collective and Ballance.

Landconnect project co-ordinator Maggie Hope says “The project is about showcasing the great work that’s already happening around the catchment. ‘By farmers for farmers’ is the guiding principle behind the video series.”

The Lake Rotorua Primary Producers Collective will work alongside Landconnect to make sure the videos are tailored to meet farmer needs. Collective spokesperson and dry stock farmer Joanna Carr says “We’ve been looking for a nutrient mitigation toolbox like this for a while now. This project is one way to get the relevant information out there.”

The videos will be published on YouTube via the Lake Rotorua Primary Producers Collective website and project partner websites by June 2017.

Additional Information

LNLUF is co-funded by Bay of Plenty Regional Council and Ministry for the Environment.

It was established to fund research that assists landowners with meeting their Nitrogen Discharge Allowance and removing 140 tonnes of nitrogen entering the lake by 2032. A total of 320 tonnes of nitrogen needs to be permanently removed to sustainably meet water quality targets set by the community.

\$1 million of the Bay of Plenty Regional Council’s \$3.3 million Low Nitrogen Land Use Fund (LNLUF) has been allocated to support landowners with making their required nitrogen reductions as part of the long term solution to protect Lake Rotorua water quality.

'That would be me,' replied old rancher John.
