#### **Age Concern**

We finally had our official opening of the Tiny Homes Project and the ribbon cutting ceremony was conducted by our local Member of Parliament, Todd McClay and he was supported by our mayor, Tania Tapsell.

Everyone that was present could see that the model for elderly housing was excellent and the tenants that spoke were very happy in their homes which were warm and safe. All the units have passed the Healthy Homes Standard for renting, and although they still have not got a CCC are very liveable.

We have had our final inspection but there are still up to eight areas that we need to address so the CCC is still a way off and of course we cannot insure non-compliant buildings which is also a major issue.

On the 24th of October we had our Annual General Meeting, and it resulted in several members putting themselves forward for the Trustees. This was unusual as we normally have difficulty finding people to volunteer to be on our Trustees. A new Constitution was passed prior to the AGM, and we are going to renew, and stay as, an Incorporated Society. The Membership fee increase was also passed at the AGM and had not increased for several years. The new cost to join is \$20.00 with \$30.00 for a couple and extra if you want the newsletter posted out.

I was a guest Panellist at the Second New Zealand Hindu Elders Conference at the Hindu Heritage Centre in Rotorua and spoke about the variety of programmes that Age Concern have running at present. We are encouraging different ethnic groups to join us as members. We also met with the Ethnic Council to discuss how we could develop more of an on-going relationship and pool resources. The different ethnicities were unaware of the many programmes they could access as members. New programmes that we have started up recently with funding from National office are the Steady as you go which is a balance class, Just Cook4 Healthy Ageing and Walkers with Walkers for Social Connection.

We were fortunate to get some funding from the Charity House Project at the Toi Ohomai Institute and we were able to produce and print a Cookbook with a difference. The recipes all have a story with them about why the recipe was chosen and the reasons for the selection are varied. The finished product is for sale for \$25.00 at our office and it is a limited edition as we only have 100 printed.

New Zealand's retirement system was ranked as a B in a new report, while Australia received a B+. New Zealand's retirement system - made up mostly of KiwiSaver and NZ Super - was ranked 14th out of 48 around the world.

The ranking, by Mercer, looked at schemes' adequacy, sustainability and integrity. It ranked New Zealand a B overall. Australia received a B+. The New Zealand system scored more poorly on adequacy - which covers the income people receive in retirement - slipping from 25th to 28th place or a C+ by that measure.

The Netherlands took the top spot, ahead of Iceland and Denmark. KiwiSaver is the fastest growing invested asset in the country, having surpassed \$100 billion. As the KiwiSaver system matures, and we are starting to see the benefits play out for retirees through a supplemented retirement income, we now need to ensure that savers of all ages understand the importance of retirement planning and decumulation strategies.

The success of a long-term savings plan will be boosted by additional contributions from employers and the government, and these should be underpinned by an overall enhancement in the importance of KiwiSaver

as part of a financial plan.

The Netherlands had a similar universal pension and other savings and investment schemes alongside it that were generally industry-based. But they have much higher combined contribution rates, that's sitting at 12 percent compared to NZ which is 6% at the top.

Lifting KiwiSaver contribution rates would improve the country's standing in the index, as well as increasing the amount of assets that New Zealanders had for retirement. The combined contribution rate should be heading up to more like 10 percent.

Countries that performed well in the rankings were also those that not only looked at accumulation of a pension asset but how it was accessed once people retired.

That might mean offering people the ability to sign up for an ongoing stream of income, for example, rather than lump sum withdrawals from KiwiSaver.

NZ Super is often described as one of the more generous in the world because it is available to almost all New Zealanders.

But if that did not continue, it could make New Zealand's system less internationally competitive.

join in the fun! Wednesday evenings tee off from 4pm – 6pm no need to book.







It will apply to domestic payments made between New Zealand bank accounts when setting up a new account, making a one-off payment, or editing an existing account to pay online.


The service is being launched by New Zealand's banks by November 2024, with full implementation across digital banking platforms expected by Easter 2025.



#### **News from Fish and Game**

The season has kicked off with a bang in the Eastern Fish & Game region. Hundreds of anglers flocked to the Rotorua lakes to fish, relax and meet up with friends and family on what has become a popular tradition in the region.

And the fish didn't disappoint either! Lake Tarawera in particular, produced the best opening day fish we've seen in over 20 years with hatchery fish released during autumn 2023 coming in at 583mm and 2.45kg. This is a whopping 600g heavier than the last opening day. Lakes Rotoiti and Okataina also excelled, with both producing fish that exceeded the previous year's catch.

With settled spring weather warming local waters we are beginning to see good browns cruising the flat shallow water on Lake Rotorua. Some excellent fish are being caught at the stream mouths between Ngongotaha and Hamurana and this is a trend that will continue to develop as the water warms. The trigger water temperature for these impressive fish to begin running into the streams is normally about 19 degrees Celsius – so keep a close eye on lake temps through November. There's a link (https://envdata.boprc.govt.nz/Data/Dashboard/151) to the Bay of Plenty Regional Council monitoring which includes water temperatures.

Spring is also the time when the smaller, and lesser-known lakes fish well. Locations such as Okaro, Ngapouri, Rerewhakaaitu can provide excellent sport either from the shore or by boat. Insect activity is on a rapid rise as we come out of winter. Damsel and dragon fly larvae and chironomid buzzers are all useful ways of targeting hungry fish around the margins.

Don't forget too that smelt are a key food source at all times so keep the box topped up with a few Grey Ghost type flies, silvery Toby's and lighter coloured Tassies.

Insect activity is also on the rise in all of the streams and rivers of the region and having been blessed with settled weather, the rivers are running low and clear.

#### Do the trout keep fooling you?!

Come along to Eastern F & G Boat Fishing How-to Talk and Demonstration, Saturday 4th of January 2025 at the hatchery at 1130 Paradise Valley Road, Ngongotaha. It's free to attend and covers off all the basics of catching trout from boats on our lakes. Keep an eye on Eastern Fish & Games Facebook page for details.


that the planting proceeded at pace. (photo page 21)

We have recently caught up with Jack Gear's Granddaughter Sandra - she and her Mum are both well. Jack Gear Q.S.M. was the Rotorua Sheep Dog Trial Club's president for over 30 years. One of the items donated by the Gear whanau to the Ngongotaha Life Memories Museum is the Programme for the 1997 "Tux" North Island & New Zealand Sheepdog Trial Championships held on the Ngongotaha Station property, by kind permission of Ngati Whakaue Tribal Lands Inc., Valley Road Ngongotaha. Today the area is planted in Pine Trees and one land mark once visible was a large rock that the sheep used to play 'ringa ringa rosie' around, with the

dogs. This caused some of the Farmers in control of their dogs total heart ache, but resulted in great laughter from the spectators.

Also, as each exhibitor was on a 'time limit', when time was up and the sheep were still playing around the rock, the Farmer's temperament was pushed to the limit and often the Potae/ Hat was thrown to the ground. Or he frothed up so much at the mouth, that he couldn't get a whistle out and with a splutter and spit it was a 'Lost Moment'. Some famous dog names included; Boy, Dell, Sue, Mate, Flash, Queen, and Kip to mention a few. Mate was a very prominent name but of course 'Get in Behind Boy!!!' was often heard.

I mention all of this as the Rotorua A & P (Agricultural and Pastoral) Show is back for the 116th Year. The programme looks amazing, with so much to see and do plus a FREE Kids Area with a bouncy castle, Ferris Wheel and large slide. To the best of our knowledge Dog Trials are still held, (not in Rotorua) but are more connected with larger Sheep Stations today, as small farmers now ride motorbikes with the dog hanging on at the back.

#### **Opportunity cost**

There is a saying that 'hurt people, hurt people'. Nowhere is this truer I think than in legal disputes between relationship partners or family members. This month's column is more a reflective piece, but I do hope it helps readers in some way.

I've been involved in some terribly sad files recently. The sort where each side has a different interpretation or perception of things that have happened, historic personal hurts and grievances are triangulated and laid bare, personal insults and barbs are thrown, alleged 'faults' get cherry picked to support the feelings of hurt and emotion (also designed to demonstrate the 'goodness' of the alleging party in the process).

Often, too, one party engages in vindictive or 'one-up' actions to maintain feelings of control over the situation and/or to try and force the other into capitulating to their demands. Sometimes things get to the point where relationships are irreparable and there's no hope of going back. There are no winners in these situations.

While it may be a cathartic exercise for a person to want their lawyer to engage in that sort of carry on, all it does is unhelpfully distract and shift the focus away from the actual issues to be resolved. It also pushes the parties further apart and entrenches each in their positions. It is not good lawyering, and it is not good clienting.

One recent relationship property matter was at risk of heading south. Financial disclosure was made between the parties, and it was a relatively simply relationship property division split 50/50 in accordance with the legislation. The figures were modest but at least it enabled each party to move on via a formal written agreement and didn't need to go to court (note most relationship property splits don't go to court because the legislation provides for how property is to be divided).

Except the party buying my client out of her share of the family home felt they'd been more of a financial provider and that my client should agree to take a bit less than she was entitled to under the legislation: i.e. – he was suggesting something that he wasn't entitled to.

However, when discussing goals with my client it was clear one of her key objectives was to maintain the good relationship between them for the sake of their child. In the back of my client's mind, she was thinking about school and life events that both parents would be involved with in coming years. She wanted both parents to do that with grace, not animosity. She also wanted to get on with her own life and cut financial and emotional ties as quickly as possible to maintain that relationship.

The other key thing was my client had found the perfect house to buy within budget in a fairly sought after area from a vendor who needed a quick sale and had priced the house accordingly. The property was also within walking distance to a nearby beach and their child's primary school

The opportunity cost of dragging out time and legal costs arguing over a relatively small shortfall with her ex paled in comparison to missing out on the deal she was getting on the house on which she felt she was likely quicky to recoup any shortfall given its location: a house that she might not otherwise find again, or the market might have moved quickly and she could have found herself priced out of the area.

Accepting the lesser deal on the relationship property division meant she could achieve her goals of moving on quickly and into the perfect home while also maintaining the parenting relationship with her ex-partner. Accepting the lesser deal also meant her ex could remain in the house which also meant continuity and stability for their child as well.

So, while the property relationships legislation is clear on the asset pool being divided evenly, it would be fair to say that the courts also want people to have the ability to resolve their issues themselves which the legislation provides the mechanisms for. Sometimes it's not all about an exact 50/50 financial split, so long as it's fair and reasonable and not too far off the mark.

The takeaway from this article is that sometimes there's value in looking outside the square at the opportunity cost involved in not dragging out disputes and achieving a swift, clean break.
