Memorial Mural in Ngongotaha

Readers may have noticed a mural recently painted upstairs at the junction of Taui Street and Ngongotaha Road. This was revealed on 15/01/2025 to mark what would have been the 16th birthday of Trustis Eraia Te Mete Gear, who died tragically in a car accident on the 31st October 2024.

Trustis was a go-getter, a young man who embraced the outdoors with passion—hunting, fishing, and riding motorbikes were his joys. His infectious smile and love for people, especially his elders, made him a beacon of positivity and a natural leader among his peers.

Despite his short time on Earth, he left an indelible mark on people from all walks of life. He was well known for these characteristics, which is why the owner of the building was happy to have the mural installed by Taumata Sullivan. Previously, his friends had tagged signs in his memory, but his family apologized for this, and encouraged them to instead support this mural and future endeavours to lift rangatahi in our village.



It is hoped this inspires youth to channel their energy into positive things, to find healthy ways to face challenges, and to embrace one another with kindness and love. The proverb in the mural is "E kore au e ngaro he kākano ahau i ruia mai i Rangiatea": I can never be lost as I am a seed born of greatness.

This mural serves as a reminder that we all carry a legacy of resilience, compassion and greatness within us. Though the seed may seem lost, with the right love and care, it blossoms again to share its beauty with the world. Trustis embodied this truth, and his memory encourages us to live fully, cherish every moment, and uplift one another.

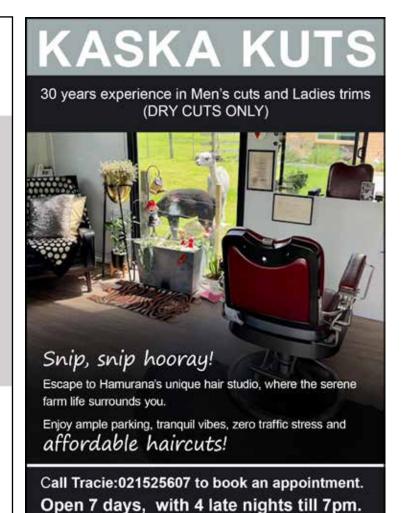

Whooping Cough

Health New Zealand has confirmed that an infant died over the Christmas period after contracting pertussis (commonly known as whooping cough), which is highly contagious and can cause serious harm to babies.

"Because babies cannot be vaccinated until they are six weeks old, the best protection for them is for anyone who is pregnant to get the vaccine, which means that their immunity is then passed onto pēpi. The vaccine is safe, free and most effective when given from 16 weeks of pregnancy and should be given during each pregnancy to provide the best protection for each baby."

There have been 1232 cases of whooping cough notified since the onset of the epidemic (19 October) and 101 cases needed to be hospitalised. Of those hospitalised, 48 were under one-year-old. The whooping cough vaccination was highly effective at preventing death and serious illness, however the rate of people getting it was dropping nationally, and was at the lowest it had ever been for Māori. Part of the issue was awareness.



What to do if you suspect your child has whooping cough

Health NZ said whooping cough in pēpi was unpredictable and could get worse very quickly. Parents should also seek urgent medical advice if their pēpi:

- · Stops breathing
- Goes blue with coughing
- Appears to have a cold, then cough and have difficulty breathing
- Gets exhausted from coughing
- Is not able to feed properly because of coughing and difficulty breathing
- · Loses weight because of difficulty feeding and because the cough causes them to vomit.

For more information, or help to book a vaccination, parents can call the Vaccination Healthline free, on 0800 28 29 26 (8:30am-5pm Monday to Friday) or visit info.health.nz/bookavaccine. Anyone with a cough for two weeks or more, or a cough that ends with a 'whoop' sound or vomiting, should seek medical advice by contacting a doctor or calling Healthline for free, on 0800 611 116.

The Waiteti Stream Mouth Wetland Project

Before Christmas 2 volunteers turned up, Tracey and Chris, and spent a good couple of hours over a few days cutting and poisoning willow and grubbing out bits of wattle, broom, gorse and bramble. Hard work in the hot sun. Later, I contacted Environment BOP and they have been very helpful, my contact George came round with more plant poison and is keen to attend our working bees coming up later in February 15th and 22nd, Saturday mornings, 9 o'clock start.

What is the purpose of the working bees?

Willow, alder, wattle, gorse, broom, bramble and other seeds are scattered by the wind and birds, they all seem to thrive in the landscape of the wetlands. With time, they are only going to get bigger and bigger and block the view. The view is our biggest asset, people enjoy an uninterrupted view of the lake from the walkway.

What to bring: sunhat, gloves, strong footwear, water bottle and garden fork, cutters, and saws... we have six bottles of poison to support six cutters Wetland Wildlife

My neighbour Gary tells me, we have a resident rabbit down by the river mouth, a big fella too. Every evening the seagulls, dotterels, blackbirds, thrushes and more, do a dance out on the grass. The seagulls need a wide personal space from each other, the dotterels dart in and out between the gulls causing quite a commotion when they enter the gulls personal space, it is the same routine every night. Pukeko and Kotuku, come visiting in pairs to strut their stuff. I'm not hearing frogs this year yet. There is an abundance of fantails, Piwakawaka dancing around as the swallows chase and catch the moths for food.

Harakeke Flax

To my untrained eye it seems that we have a variety of harakeke growing on the boundary of the wetlands, they are part of 600 wetland plants gifted by EnvBOP that we planted in 2016. If anyone out there can help identify what we have got and whether they are useful for weaving that would be good. The tui don't seem to have a preference, they sail in, land and feed off them all. Finally, a big thanks to Hone Newton, Ngati Tura and Guy Ngatai, Ngati Ngararanui for inviting me to a meeting with the EnvBOP water engineers a year or so ago to discuss the Waiteti stream mouth water flow, which logs can be removed and best practice for the care of the river banks and wetland.

Summer food safety (MPI and NZ Food Safety) Bacteria on food can multiply much faster in warmer weather especially Campylobacter from raw or undercooked chicken.

Handling chicken safely

To keep your whānau and friends healthy, follow these simple tips:

- Don't wash your chicken before preparing it. Water doesn't kill bacteria, so rinsing the chicken will just spread the bacteria to other surfaces. If you want to remove raw chicken juices, just pat the chicken dry with a paper towel instead.
- Wash your hands in warm soapy water for at least 20 seconds after handling raw chicken and dry them on a clean towel. This is so any bacteria from the chicken won't spread from your hands to other food.
- Keep your raw chicken separate from cooked chicken and ready-to-eat and fresh foods, using separate chopping boards, plates, and utensils. Alternatively, wash them properly with hot soapy water before using them for other foods.
- Make sure the chicken is fully and evenly cooked before serving the juices should run clear. If you have one, use a meat thermometer to ensure the chicken is steaming hot (more than 75°C) all the way through.

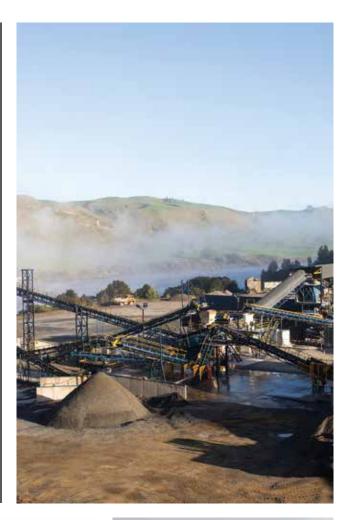
BBQ food safety tips

- · Keep your food and any leftovers covered and chilled.
- Make sure your barbecue and cooking tools have been cleaned with soap and water before using.
- · Have separate utensils, plates, and other equipment for raw and cooked foods. If you only use one set, germs can spread from raw meats to cooked foods.
- · Make sure raw meat doesn't touch cooked food or ready-to-eat foods (like salads).
- Barbecue meat until it is steaming hot (over 75°C) all the way through.
- Marinate meat in a covered container in the fridge. Cook the marinade before pouring it over cooked foods.
- Keep a chilly bag or bin in your car or use ice packs to transport chilled or frozen foods, and transfer them to the fridge or freezer as soon as you get home.
- Use ice packs if you have long travel times after shopping or won't be going home straight away.

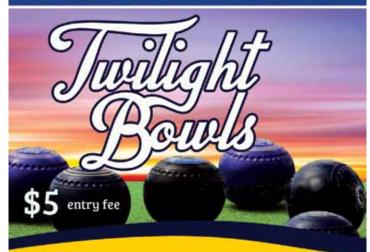

Age Concern

Welcome back to another year in the life of Age Concern Rotorua and although we have finally got tenants in our Tiny Homes, this year is going to be a much harder year to attract sufficient funding to maintain our present staff and programmes. Most funders are also struggling, and applications are almost 50% of what is applied for, so Charities, like us, will have to continually seek funding from a variety of sources.

Are you over 65 years, or know someone who is, why not join Age Concern and take advantage of the many programmes we have on offer which are mainly designed to reduce loneliness and increase social connection.

Membership is \$20 a year, for a single, and \$25 a year for a couple. Joining can be done online or pop in and see us next to Parksyde. We have EFTPOS and would love to hear from you.

Programmes on offer this year include:

Visiting Service which sees volunteers make weekly visits to people who are identified as lonely or Socially Isolated.

Staying Safe is an adult driving refresher course for elderly drivers and involves going through the Road Code, which for many is the first time they have looked at it since they got their licence.

Steady as You Go which is an Age Concern balance programme the is well researched and has considerable success for the participants.

Just Cook4 Healthy Ageing is a cooking programme designed to assist elderly who are not used to cooking, to be able to cook cost effective, nutritious meals, for one or two.

The Seminar Series is a series of 10 seminars, on topics relevant to the elderly, and they are held in partnership with Parksyde and those delivering the seminars. An example of the type of seminars includes Enduring Power of Attorney and Wills, Arranging a Funeral, Keeping Safe at Home, Moving to a Rest Home or Retirement Village, Reverse Mortgages to name a few.

Out and Abouters which is a weekly excursion in our van and is designed to reduce Social Isolation and loneliness.

Talking Tech on Tuesday is a series of technology seminars in partnership with Seniornet and Parksyde. Age Concern also have a drop-in programme with Seniornet, in our office on a Thursday which gives people one on one tuition on tech devices.

Walkers with Walkers is a weekly programme designed to get less mobile people out and about to increase their Social Connection.

Coffee Club is a weekly visit to a different Café for Coffee and a chat which once again increases Social Connection.

Funding permitting, we hope to reinstate our Handyman Maintenance Service, which has our Handyman doing odd maintenance jobs for members in their own home, and the customer pays \$20 an hour, no matter what the job, and we top it up to a reasonable hourly rate.

The staff at Age Concern will remain the same for 2025 unless there are some unforeseen financial issues.

Karyn Rogers who oversees the Visiting Service, Volunteers, Staying Safe, Steady as you go. Katreece Lewis who oversees Out and Abouters, Walkers with Walkers, Coffee Club, Just Cook4 Healthy Ageing. Diana Walker who oversees Wellness and visits our members to assess their physical and mental wellbeing. Kirsten Harman who oversees admin, newsletter, Maintenance Handyman.

Changes to Tenancy laws

This month's column briefly looks at some of the staged changes to the Residential Tenancies Act affecting both tenants and landlords coming into effect in January and March 2025. Some changes are a partial roll-back to familiar previous notice periods for ending tenancies, but there are also some new changes and clarifications.

Ending Periodic Tenancies - A tenant can end a periodic tenancy with 21 days' notice. A landlord has 2 options for ending a periodic tenancy:

No-cause terminations allowed so long as landlord gives 90 days' notice, and provided the notice isn't retaliation for a tenant exercising their rights under the Act (eg: a tenant complaining about something).

42 days' notice of termination where

- * the property is required for the landlord or their family within 90 days of the tenancy ending (they must remain in the property for 90 days, too);
- * On an unconditional agreement for the sale of the property with vacant possession (i.e.: the buyer is not taking the tenancy over on settlement)'
- * The property is required for employees or contractors of the landlord, but this must already be stated in the existing tenancy agreement. The property must be usually used for this purpose (eg: farm or orchard worker accommodation).

Some notice periods still apply under the old rules in certain situations and at different points in a tenancy. To clarify your particular situation visit: https://www.tenancy.govt.nz/law-changes/

Notices – Landlords and tenants can give notices and documents to an 'electronic address' if it has been provided as an address for service in the tenancy agreement. A physical address for service will still need to be provided, though. An 'electronic address' is an email address, fax number, mobile telephone number, or instant messaging account which is easily accessible. Whatever

the medium, it must first be in the tenancy agreement as an address for service.

The changes also mean that if an email address was included as an address for service in a tenancy agreement or was used by a tenant to communicate with the landlord, that email address can be used for up to 2 years after the tenancy ends in a tenancy tribunal application, including where a tenancy ended more than 2 years ago.

Smoking - The changes clarify that clauses in a tenancy agreement banning tobacco product smoking indoors are enforceable in the Tenancy Tribunal, but any ban must balance tenant's rights. An example I can think of might be a ban on smoking in a dwelling vs a total smoking ban.

Other Changes - The Tenancy Tribunal may elect whether to decide any dispute without holding a hearing so long as the dispute is not about termination of a tenancy or landlord's right of entry to the premises or a boarding room. This means that an adjudicator can decide the dispute based on the application and supporting documents filed, without the parties having to be at the hearing.

Family Violence - A tenant can already withdraw from a tenancy due to family violence. The changes clarify that a tenant's children or dependants are also covered by this provision. A tenant can withdraw from a tenancy by giving at least 2 days' notice without financial penalty or the need for the landlord to agree with the notice. However, the tenant must provide qualifying evidence of family violence.
