

Age Concern

Denis Arnott, one of our valued members, was awarded a Dignity Champion Award from Head Office for his valuable contribution to the elderly of Rotorua. Denis used to be a shopping volunteer until he could no longer drive so he purchased a Mobility Scooter which he had for about six months and then felt the need to upgrade to a sleeker, faster machine. He donated his original Scooter to us to be loaned, at no cost, to any member who had a need for a short term, or a long-term ability to get around and do shopping or join in social connection groups. Besides that, he belongs to a Social Wellness group which meets on a Thursday, and it is not uncommon for him to do some baking for the group. Denis is a deserving recipient of the Award, and he receives 20 to 30 frozen meals donated by Frozen Fresh group. We still have 2 mobility scooters for indefinite loan at no cost to any members of Age Concern. If you would like one just join Age Concern for \$20.00 and apply.

Our Garage Sale, held at the Hindu Heritage Hall, was a great deal of hard work for the \$1,000.00 we made. There were an awful lot of goods left which we gave to Love Soup to give away for free.

We have formed a partnership with Love Soup, and we are the recipients of the leftover School lunches which are frozen and we give out to our members in need. Our next project is to build some raised vegetable gardens so we can send out some vegetables with our frozen meals.

I have several single and married members who would be happy to downsize to a tiny home which they would purchase. We could set up a Pocket Neighbourhood of like-minded elderly if we could find some land to be gifted to Age Concern or, at the very least, leased to the householders who would pay a minimal lease. If you are in a position do this, please ring me and make someone's day.

A growing number of over-65s are reliant on NZ Super. In fact, 40 percent have virtually no other income and 20 percent have only a little more. Even with NZ Super as it stands, only 43 percent of New Zealanders are confident they will have a financially comfortable retirement. NZ Super can provide a higher level of financial security than some may have previously encountered. It's particularly significant for individuals with disabilities, carers, those who have experienced irregular employment periods, or have received low pay throughout their working lives.

Presently, many older New Zealanders are working beyond the age of eligibility to NZ Super, some because they choose to but many because they need to cover remaining mortgage payments, rental obligations, or have insufficient savings. Many will need to fund 30 years or more past the pension age. Every day about 80 people turn 65 and 20 people turn 85. By 2050, these numbers will be 95 and close to 60. With an ageing population, it's no secret that expenditure on NZ Super will increase as more people become eligible. But while an aging population is important to understand, it can't be considered in isolation. Housing affordability is a growing concern for the over-65 population. Growing numbers of people over 65 are facing high housing costs or do not have access to housing wealth they could

draw down to support themselves. There are significant disparities in income and wealth among the over-65 population – particularly between people in work and those not in work, and between people who have accumulated housing and other wealth and those who haven't been able to.

And it's not just the population over 65 we need to think about. There is a growing generation of people – sometimes called the sandwich generation – caring for both their children and their ageing parents which is likely to impact their own retirement saving. So, imagine the implications if NZ Super did not exist, or if it were changed so it no longer provided an adequate buffer against pension poverty.

NZ Super is a taonga to be treasured, not a burden.



Community Halls: Feedback to be sought on Long-term strategy

Community input will be sought to aid the development of a long-term strategy for Rotorua district's community halls for consideration in the next Long-term Plan. Rotorua Lakes Council members have received a briefing on community halls that included background, the condition of halls, known usage, financial status and current known issues.

Background

Rotorua has 10 halls, in Kaharoa, Ōkāreka, Mamaku, Ngakuru, Ngongotaha, Reporoa, Rerewhakaaitu (2), Waikite Valley and Reporoa, built by the various communities they serve between 1945 and 1980 and vested with council in the mid-1980s. The halls serve about 9,390 residents in total and are used for social and community activities.


Currently, each hall is overseen by a committee which is responsible for, among others, the following tasks:



- managing bookings and usage;
- reporting to council quarterly on usage and identified issues;
- collecting and depositing booking revenue into council accounts;
- notifying the council of any identified maintenance issues;
- overseeing facility cleaning. Council uses preferred suppliers to carry out compliance checks and undertake building maintenance and renewals, within the limits of allocated budgets.

Hall assessments

Last year, council conducted initial structural assessments of all community halls, resulting in the interim closure of the Reporoa and Mamaku halls due to identified structural compliance issues. Interim interventions on these two halls are now in progress.

Remedial work has begun on Mamaku Memorial Hall with completion proposed for approximately February 2025.

The council is now working on developing a long-term facility management plan for all halls to address required interventions for critical structural elements, such as frames and foundations



and other essential internal components, including electrical, plumbing, and painting, to ensure appropriate maintenance of the halls to fit their purpose and usage. The economic lifespan of a building is approximately 75 years.

Community insights

Feedback from communities to date indicates they highly value their halls as central hubs for social interaction and community activities and want to see better coordination between use and maintenance. The council will continue to gather public input regarding all community halls.

Council will look to go out to communities to seek their feedback on the long-term plan for halls. Input from the public will help to determine the ideal number of halls needed for the district and whether to upgrade, maintain, or replace current facilities.



Undue influence/ duress/coercion

One of the less pleasant aspects of lawyering are situations where a vulnerable person is impacted by undue influence, duress or coercion (UDC). When boiled down, UDC centres around someone else holding the balance of power or trying to manipulate or exert coercive control over another person or a situation in one way or another.

When speaking with clients I often chat about unrelated things looking out for possible mental incapacity as well as any signs of UDC. Some common examples of vulnerability might include one of the partners in a domestic relationship and elderly people but could also be any relationship where there is a stronger party that is or could exert power or control over another. Two instances of UDC have occurred in my office fairly recently.

A long-standing elderly client makes an appointment and advises he's bringing in his son with him. Sadly, I already know why the son is coming in: he's been pressuring his vulnerable elderly parent about preserving inheritances. And so it was. My client shares his significant health deterioration and has likely only months to live. His second wife of 30+ years is in dementia care already. Any estate is going to be modest in the vicinity of \$200k.

The son starts talking over his father that he's come in to sort out his father's share of the estate, so he and his siblings don't get disinherited by it all going to my client's wife by survivorship and spent on her dementia care and likely not being told by her children when she eventually passes away.

Things become a bit heated with the son, and my client points out that it is me that acts for him, and that he wants to make sure that his estate is used for his wife's ongoing care before any inheritances. It was evident to me the purpose of the appointment was so the son could hear what my client's wishes were and to get the son off his back. My client knew I'd back him up. The son packed up in a huff and left.

The other incident that occurred recently is one of those situations where someone tries to elicit information about the contents of an elderly person's will. In this case my elderly client has advancing dementia but is still mentally capable.

She got her affairs in order a couple of years back with an updated will and powers of attorney to a daughter for personal care and welfare (with whom my client owns a share in a house where they both live), and the husband of another daughter (who both live overseas) appointed for property. Neither document comes into effect until my client is deemed incapable by her doctor. There have been several attempts over the years by the husband to find out the contents of my client's will.

Reading between the lines, his underlying concern is whether my client has left her share in the house in her will to the daughter who owns the other share in the house - and looks after my client - effectively disinheriting the husband's wife. I have found his manner to be quite domineering and manipulative with a view that because he is the property attorney he's entitled to it: he's absolutely not while my client still has capacity, or until she instructs me to provide him a copy.

Notably, I haven't ever had an approach from either of my client's own daughters for the same information. I politely indicated that I can only provide a copy of my client's personal documents on her instructions and suggest that perhaps my client could call me if she wanted a copy, or I can arrange a home visit with it.

By now I am very concerned my quite vulnerable client is being pressured by the husband over releasing a copy of her will. I had resolved to go and see her in person with a copy if it became necessary.

Still pushing, he casually emails me a week later and says that everyone has gone out and he is sitting with my client who can't recall what is in her will and could I email a copy through to his email address ... Unbelievable! The answer was, of course, reiterating the same as I had relayed previously.

The takeaway from this month's column is that UDC is alive and well everywhere, and to think twice when trying to pressure anyone or their lawyer for information because it does not reflect well.
