On age and wisdom

Bickering with your spouse is like trying to read the Terms of Use for a new service. In the end, you just give up and click "I agree."

With age comes wisdom ... and hair in really weird places.

How can you tell if someone is aging gracefully? Look for the laughter lines, not the frown lines!

"They say with age comes wisdom. So, when does the wisdom kick in?"

"I'm so old that when I was a kid, rainbows were in black and white."

"I'm not old; I'm just young at heart and slightly older in other places."

Age Concern

What are the most pressing issues that are facing our elderly today? To my mind all the issues revolve around the housing crisis facing our elderly.

The misconception that is around is that we, the baby boomers, as we are called, have had it easy over our lifetime and as a result have been able to buy our own home, which in most cases is now Mortgage Free. It is all relevant as we were initially on a very small salary and most of us started out with two mortgages with the second being as high as 24% interest and often the first mortgage being around 10% interest.

An example of how housing can affect many areas of living is one of our members who has had to settle for a motel room, which is relatively cheap at \$350 a week, including power and internet, but is shared with some undesirables upstairs, and as a result she is scared and very lonely. The whole scenario is taking a toll on her mental health and wellbeing, and she cannot at this time see a way out.

The population living in Aotearoa New Zealand is likely to grow from 5.3 million currently to eclipse 6 million by 2040, according to projections released by Stats NZ. Two-thirds of that growth is likely to come from net international migration (migrant arrivals less migrant departures), with the remainder from natural increase (births less deaths).

New Zealand's net migration has fluctuated widely from year to year. International migration has been the main contributor to New Zealand's population growth this century, and this is projected to continue. The projections indicate New Zealand's population increasing to around 7 million by 2060, and potentially nearly 8 million by the late 2070s. A much older population is projected, with the median age in the late 40s from the 2060s, compared with 38 years currently. Half the population is younger, and half older, than the median age.

There are currently about 900,000 people aged 65 years and over living in New Zealand. The projections indicate the 65+ population is likely to reach 1 million by 2029, 1.5 million in the early 2050s, and 2 million around 2070.

The number of people aged 65 years and over is currently increasing by more than 500 people a week. One in 6 New Zealanders is now aged 65 and over. By the mid-2030s this will be 1 in 5, and by 2060 about 1 in 4 will be in this age group.

In the mid-1960s, 1 in 12 New Zealanders were aged 65 years and over. Natural increase is no longer the main driver of New Zealand's population growth. In contrast, if net migration was 100,000 people every year, the population reaches 7 million around 2040, 9 million in the late 2050s, and 11 million in the early 2070s.

A new study suggests that a 'positive attitude' towards ageing could aid recovery after sustaining injuries in a fall. Falls among older adults are a significant public health issue. The study involved 694 individuals in England aged 60 to 90 who had not experienced a fall in the two years prior. Researchers analyzed data on falls alongside survey responses gauging participants' beliefs and attitudes about ageing.

Factors such as walking pace, activity levels, and the need for assistance with daily tasks like dressing or bathing after a fall were also assessed. The findings indicate that those with more positive perceptions of ageing – for example, believing that ageing did not hinder their ability to do what they wanted – tended to recover better after a fall.

"We found that older individuals who had more positive self-perceptions of ageing at baseline were better protected against negative physical consequences following a fall. People who had the highest possible score on the "self-perceptions of ageing" measurements – or having the most positive mindset about ageing – had 162% lower odds of showing slow walking speed, 200% lower odds of being dependent on others to perform daily living activities and were 123% less likely to be inactive following a fall, compared to those who were not positive about ageing.

So, what does that all mean? Even as you grow older, stay active, think positively and don't stop doing what you enjoy doing even if it is harder to do.

Ngongotaha GPs are the cornerstone of our community.

They're the first port of call when your child has a fever, your mum needs a repeat prescription, or something just doesn't feel right. But for too long, getting an appointment has been harder than it should be.

It's part of a \$1.37 billion package for Health New Zealand through Budget 2025, focused on delivering timely, quality care closer to home.

Too many New Zealanders have been stuck on waitlists or turned away because their GP is full. This investment means more appointments, shorter waits, and stronger support to keep fees low – especially for families doing it tough.

The funding package includes a 13.89% funding increase for GP clinics to help them see more patients and ease wait times. It also provides targeted support to keep care affordable for low-income families and under-14s.

Performance payments are being targeted to help clinics lift childhood immunisation rates, especially at key milestones like the six-week vaccination. 
Kaharoa School rounded up term 2 with a number of fantastic events, including house sports, two cross countries, and a Matariki celebration.



Avian influenza screening update.

Fish and Game help facilitate the national MPI avian influenza screening programme during our summer duck banding project.

This is a critical part of tracking the prevalence on non-pathogenic avian influenza in New Zealand. Principal Scientist/Veterinary Virologist, Dr Wlodek Stanislawek, has confirmed that the COVID-19 test-like samples taken from ducks caught during our duck banding this summer have finished the PCR process and have not shown anything untoward at this stage.



Scion/ Mamaku Blue Cooperation

A collaboration between Scion and Rotorua's Mamaku Blue winery could soon see consumers enjoying their blueberries in sustainable trays.

The partnership is developing moulded fibre trays infused with blueberry pomace – turning agricultural waste into a sustainable, compostable alternative to plastic packaging. The work aims to reduce waste while supporting New Zealand's circular bioeconomy.

With funding from the Bioresource Processing Alliance (BPA) Summer Student Internship, Scion researchers are working with partners to explore whether incorporating agricultural byproducts into moulded fibre trays can enhance their strength and moisture resistance.

These performance factors currently limit fibre-based alternatives to plastic. Kate Parker, Scion's Team Lead for Sustainable Materials, says the global drive to eliminate single-use plastic packaging has created a need for high-performance, eco-friendly alternatives.

"Moulded fibre packaging is a sustainable, compostable option, but it often falls short in strength and moisture resistance compared to plastic. By incorporating agricultural byproducts, we hope to improve the functionality of fibre trays and provide an innovative use for materials that would otherwise end up in landfill."



Property Co-ownership

I've noticed there's been an uptick post-covid of people looking to pool resources and purchase a home via co-ownership or other housing arrangements (excluding formal tenancies or relationship partners). In fact, I've received a couple of calls on these types of arrangements in the last month. My thoughts? Don't even go there unless you get legal advice and have the arrangements drawn up by a lawyer at the outset.

It all sounds good on the face of it while everyone's in the honeymoon stage focusing on the positives of supporting each other financially with living arrangements. The problem is people don't also weigh up downsides and rationally assess the 'what if's' and whether they may be better off instead making other arrangements that don't create obligations or bind them to other people.



Typical scenarios I've come across include the increasingly common scenario of friends purchasing as co-owners (one of the main banks advertises this type of home co-ownership), a parent in their own home needing to sell a portion to an adult child for financial reasons, accommodating relatives at a family home, and adult children or parents providing the other with lump sums toward a deposit to buy a home. Without legal advice and a properly drawn up agreement covering the nature, intent and extent of these sorts of arrangements, they're ripe for a dispute about what was intended down the track.

In my view, basically, any arrangement where money is offered or accepted is a risk to both the person offering the money, and the person accepting the money. Why? Because firstly, there's no such thing as a free lunch.

Secondly, nothing is forever, and people's health, wealth, job, or other life circumstances change over time for lots of reasons. Issues then inevitably arise over differing perceptions of what financial arrangements were intended, and it all turns to custard: does the co-owner who paid for that kitchen upgrade or roof get their money back and interest or an uplift in any value added to the property?

Might money loaned or paid to the homeowner convert to a claim of a financial interest in the property? What about those seemingly innocent 'rent' or 'board' payments? What if the adult child who bought a share in Dad's home to help Dad out financially later wants to sell, but Dad's on super and banks won't lend so he can't buy the share back?

What if Dad needs or wants to sell and move elsewhere or into a retirement village and the adult child can't or won't agree to sell? These scenarios are just some examples of things that can go wrong and cause a lot of anger and hurt sorting it out.

If you're an existing homeowner or in the process of buying a home and money is offered or things are paid by someone else, I recommend being very cautious. If you're the person offering or paying the money, be very cautious, too.

Before parting with or accepting any money be sure to get your own legal advice and have the nature, intent and extent of the arrangements drawn up in a proper agreement with your solicitor. Lastly, I recommend not writing up or signing homemade agreements about money or accommodation arrangements without getting your own lawyer to look it over first. Legal fees now can save a lot of heartache later.
